The goal of this course is for students to gain hands-on experience working with the Monmouth College Native American Artifact collection in a laboratory setting. Through the handling of authentic antiquities in a scientific manner students are also introduced to the world of cultural resource management. After introductory lectures on the cultural history of Illinois, Native American archaeology and lithic technology, students spend the majority of class time accessing, cataloguing, maintaining, and promoting our collection.

For a chance to work with Native American spear points, arrow heads, and knife blades, as well as other types of artifacts register for HIST190-01 and/or 02 today.
